- But in Scriptures, we find warnings to Christians that tell us it is possible for us to live in such a way as to be lost after once being saved

"Proof" of Eternal Security

Joh 5:24 "Truly, truly, I say to you, he who hears My word, and believes Him who sent Me, has eternal life, and does not come into judgment, but has passed out of death into life.

"Proof" of Eternal Security

Joh 10:27 "My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me;

Joh 10:28 and I give eternal life to them, and they will never perish; and no one will snatch them out of My hand.

Joh 10:29 "My Father, who has given *them* to Me, is greater than all; and no one is able to snatch *them* out of the Father's hand.

Joh 10:30 "I and the Father are one."

"Proof" of Eternal Security

Rom 8:35 Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?

Rom 8:36 Just as it is written, "FOR YOUR SAKE WE ARE BEING PUT TO DEATH ALL DAY LONG; WE WERE CONSIDERED AS SHEEP TO BE SLAUGHTERED."

"Proof" of Eternal Security

Rom 8:37 But in all these things we overwhelmingly conquer through Him who loved us.

Rom 8:38 For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers,

"Proof" of Eternal Security

Rom 8:39 nor height, nor depth, nor any other created thing, will be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

"Proof" of Eternal Security

Heb 10:14 For by one offering He has perfected for all time those who are sanctified.

"Proof" of Eternal Security

- Although many insist that these passages prove a Christian can never behave in such a way as to be lost after being saved, we cannot ignore the plain warnings that teach otherwise
- To make the warnings consistent with their false belief, they insist that only those who had not truly become Christians are those who turn from hypocrisy back to the world

"Proof" of Eternal Security

- Also, they say these warnings refer to God disciplining wayward Christians but He never condemns them no matter how sinfully they live
- Despite this false teaching, we should be encouraged by the previous passages
- They clearly teach that unless we choose to leave the Lord and fall back into sin, there is no one who can separate us from His grace

Warnings To Christians To Be Faithful And Not Fall

- One error leads to another

Series Of False teachings Leading To Eternal Security

- Man born guilty of sin with perverted nature of Adam, not able to willingly respond to God for salvation
- God saves us by miraculously changing our nature
- We can do nothing to be saved except believe (apart from obedience)
- Once saved, we are always saved

Serving God Is A Continuous Willing Choice

- To commit sin or act in obedient faith are both choices we are free to make
- To become a Christian, we must have faith in Jesus to the point of repenting of sins and being baptized for forgiveness of sins
- As we do this His precious blood cleanses us from sin

No One Is Born Guilty of Sin

Deu 1:38 'Joshua the son of Nun, who stands before you, he shall enter there; encourage him, for he will cause Israel to inherit it.

Deu 1:39 'Moreover, your little ones who you said would become a prey, and your sons, who this day have no knowledge of good or evil, shall enter there, and I will give it to them and they shall possess it.

Deu 1:40 'But as for you, turn around and set out for the wilderness by the way to the Red Sea.'

Serving God Is A Continuous Willing Choice

- Even after becoming Christians, if we choose to live in sin again and turn from His grace, God will not stop us from doing so
- If we are diligent about growing in grace and knowledge and continuing to confess and turn from our sins, His blood continues to cleanse us that by His grace we may be saved

Act 2:41 So then, those who had received his word were baptized; and that day there were added about three thousand souls.
