Introduction

- Ironically, often in order to avoid a greater pain, even death, we must be willing to endure a lesser pain
- Jesus speaks in a spiritual sense of enduring a lesser pain to avoid a greater eternal pain

We willingly choose to endure a lesser pain to avoid a greater pain, even death

1. People having various surgeries to remove cancerous tumors and organs or body parts that may be affected
2. Hiker in Utah cutting off his right arm that was trapped under a large boulder in spring 2003
3. Removal of my right eye because of iritis in winter of 1982

Aron Ralston willingly endured a lesser pain to avoid death

On April 26, 2003, during a solo descent of Bluejohn Canyon in southeastern Utah, he dislodged a boulder, pinning his right wrist to the side of the canyon wall. After five days, he had to break his forearm, amputate it with a dull pocket knife to break free, make his way through the rest of the canyon, rappel down a 65-foot (20 m) drop, and hike 7 miles (11 km) to safety.

Introduction

- Jesus speaks, in a spiritual sense, of enduring a lesser pain now to avoid a greater eternal pain
- And, unlike dealing with physical pain that often cannot be completely removed, this spiritual surgery will result in the removal of eternal pain replaced by eternal glory and joy

Jesus demands painful removal of sinful members of the body to avoid eternal pain

Mat 5:27 "You have heard that it was said, 'YOU SHALL NOT COMMIT ADULTERY';
Mat 5:28 but I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lust for her has already committed adultery with her in his heart.

Jesus demands painful removal of sinful members of the body to avoid eternal pain

Mat 5:29 "If your right eye makes you stumble, tear it out and throw it from you; for it is better for you to lose one of the parts of your body, than for your whole body to be thrown into hell.

Mat 5:30 "If your right hand makes you stumble, cut it off and throw it from you; for it is better for you to lose one of the parts of your body, than for your whole body to go into hell.

Is Jesus' demand for spiritual surgery literal or figurative?

- Is Jesus saying we must literally pluck out our eyes and cut off our hands?
- Jesus speaks figuratively of the literal painful process of crucifying the members of our body, making them dead to sin
- To please God, we must remove sinful thinking, desires, attitudes, habits and relationships
- We must replace these with righteous thinking, desires and deeds that honor God

Denying self, sinful thinking, desires and deeds required to serve Christ

Luk 9:23 And He was saying to *them* all, "If anyone wishes to come after Me, he must deny himself, and take up his cross daily and follow Me.

By the gospel, we can be dead to sin, renewing our mind and living for Christ

- Beyond minimizing or eliminating future pain, we desire to feel and function better after a surgical procedure
- Spiritually, this involves replacing sinful conduct with new righteous thinking, desires, attitudes, habits and relationships in harmony with the gospel
- As we continue to do this, we become conformed to the image of His Son, Jesus

By the gospel, we can be dead to sin, renewing our mind and living for Christ

- It begins when we believe in Jesus to the point of repenting of our sins and are baptized for the forgiveness of our sins
- We renounce sin and commit ourselves to serving Christ
- As Christians, the pain continues as we keep repenting of our sins, denying ourselves sin and using our heart and members for righteousness, becoming more like Jesus each day

Painless Christianity is false

Rom 6:1 What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin so that grace may increase?

Rom 6:2 May it never be! How shall we who died to sin still live in it?

Some examples of what we must put to death in order to live for Christ

1. Gambling
2. Stealing, lying, corrupt speech
3. Immodest dress
4. Social drinking of alcohol and other mind-altering drugs
5. Pornography
6. Fornication including homosexuality
7. Adulterous marriage unauthorized by God

Crucified and raised with Christ at baptism

Rom 6:3 Or do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus have been baptized into His death?

Rom 6:4 Therefore we have been buried with Him through baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.

Our crucifixion and resurrection continues as we live the Christian life

Rom 6:11 Even so consider yourselves to be dead to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Rom 6:12 Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body so that you obey its lusts,

Our crucifixion and resurrection continues as we live the Christian life

Rom 6:13 and do not go on presenting the members of your body to sin as instruments of unrighteousness; but present yourselves to God as those alive from the dead, and your members as instruments of righteousness to God.

Change must come from the heart

Rom 6:17 But thanks be to God that though you were slaves of sin, you became obedient from the heart to that form of teaching to which you were committed,

Rom 6:18 and having been freed from sin, you became slaves of righteousness.

Change must come from the heart

Rom 12:1 Therefore I urge you, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, *which is* your spiritual service of worship.

Rom 12:2 And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect.

Change must come from the heart

Eph 3:16 that He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with power through His Spirit in the inner man,

Eph 3:17 so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith; and that you, being rooted and grounded in love,

Eph 3:20 Now to Him who is able to do far more abundantly beyond all that we ask or think, according to the power that works within us,

Eph 3:21 to Him be the glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations forever and ever. Amen.

Result – conformed to the image of His Son

Rom 8:29 For those whom He foreknew, He also predestined *to become* conformed to the image of His Son, so that He would be the firstborn among many brethren;

Col 3:1 Therefore if you have been raised up with Christ, keep seeking the things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God.

Col 3:2 Set your mind on the things above, not on the things that are on earth.

Col 3:3 For you have died and your life is hidden with Christ in God.

Col 3:4 When Christ, who is our life, is revealed, then you also will be revealed with Him in glory.

Col 3:5 Therefore consider the members of your earthly body as dead to immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed, which amounts to idolatry.

Col 3:6 For it is because of these things that the wrath of God will come upon the sons of disobedience,

Col 3:7 and in them you also once walked, when you were living in them.

Col 3:8 But now you also, put them all aside: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive speech from your mouth.

Col 3:9 Do not lie to one another, since you laid aside the old self with its evil practices,

Col 3:10 and have put on the new self who
is being renewed to a true knowledge
according to the image of the One who
created him--

Col 3:11 a renewal in which there is no
distinction between Greek and Jew,

Scythian, slave and freeman, but Christ is
all, and in all.

Col 3:12 So, as those who have been
chosen of God, holy and beloved, put on a
heart of compassion, kindness, humility,
gentleness and patience;

Col 3:13 bearing with one another, and
forgiving each other, whoever has a
complaint against anyone; just as the Lord
forgave you, so also should you.
