Introduction

- In Rom. 2:1, we read the shocking condemnation of the Jews who had received the Law of Moses, direct knowledge of God's will
- They desired above all to be right with God, obey His will and teach others to do the same
- However, their desire to be right caused them to be blinded to their own sins of pride, hypocrisy and self-righteousness

Introduction

- They trusted in themselves to be right, looking down on others while having little need for God's mercy
- We also are blessed with God's full truth in the New Testament revealing the one faith that teaches us how to be saved and behave as His one church, saved body of people
- We want to be right with God, obey His will and teach others to do the same

Introduction

- But like the Jews, due to pride, selfrighteousness and hypocrisy, we can stop searching for truth and fail to apply it to ourselves while condemning others
- We study their failings so that we can learn not to repeat them
- If we are going to be right, we must trust In a gracious, loving, merciful God through His Word and not in ourselves

Brief Overview of Romans 1-3

- Although they knew of God's character and power, the Gentiles plunged into idolatry and immorality
- And, although they knew God's will through the Law of Moses the Jews failed to see their own sins and need for God's mercy while condemning the Gentiles
- The only salvation for both Jews and Gentiles is the gospel of Christ with forgiveness obtained by faith not merit

Rejecting God The Gentiles Turn To Idolatry and Immorality

Rom 1:18 For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men who suppress the truth in unrighteousness,

Rom 1:19 because that which is known about God is evident within them; for God made it evident to them.

Rom 1:20 For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes, His eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly seen, being understood through what has been made, so that they are without excuse. Rom 1:21 For even though they knew God, they did not be or Him as God or give

Rom 1:21 For even though they knew Goo they did not honor Him as God or give thanks, but they became futile in their speculations, and their foolish heart was darkened.

Rom 1:22 Professing to be wise, they became fools,

Rom 1:24 Therefore God gave them over in the lusts of their hearts to impurity, so that their bodies would be dishonored among them.

Rom 1:25 For they exchanged the truth of God for a lie, and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen.

Rom 3:24 being justified as a gift by His grace through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus;

Rom 3:25 whom God displayed publicly as a propitiation in His blood through faith. This was to demonstrate His righteousness, because in the forbearance of God He passed over the sins previously committed;

Rom 1:28 And just as they did not see fit to acknowledge God any longer, God gave them over to a depraved mind, to do those things which are not proper,

Rom 1:30 slanderers, haters of God, insolent, arrogant, boastful, inventors of evil, disobedient to parents,

We Sin When We Approve of Those That Practice Sin

1Co 5:1 It is actually reported that there is immorality among you, and immorality of such a kind as does not exist even among the Gentiles, that someone has his father's wife.

1Co 5:2 You have become arrogant and have not mourned instead, so that the one who had done this deed would be removed from your midst.

We Sin When We Approve of Those That Practice Sin

Luk 14:26 "If anyone comes to Me, and does not hate his own father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be My disciple.

Luk 14:27 "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after Me cannot be My disciple.

We Must Speak Out Against Sin

Eph 5:7 Therefore do not be partakers with them:

Eph 5:8 for you were formerly darkness, but now you are Light in the Lord; walk as children of Light

Eph 5:9 (for the fruit of the Light consists in all goodness and righteousness and truth), Eph 5:10 trying to learn what is pleasing to the Lord.

Eph 5:11 Do not participate in the unfruitful deeds of darkness, but instead even expose them;

We Must Be Doers of God's Word

Jas 1:21 Therefore, putting aside all filthiness and all that remains of wickedness, in humility receive the word implanted, which is able to save your souls.

We Must Be Doers of God's Word

Jas 1:24 for once he has looked at himself and gone away, he has immediately forgotten what kind of person he was.

Jas 1:25 But one who looks intently at the perfect law, the law of liberty, and abides by it, not having become a forgetful hearer but an effectual doer, this man will be blessed in what he does.

We Must Be Doers of God's Word

Jas 1:26 If anyone thinks himself to be religious, and yet does not bridle his tongue but deceives his own heart, this man's religion is worthless.

Jas 1:27 Pure and undefiled religion in the sight of our God and Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their distress, and to keep oneself unstained by the world.

They Trusted In Externals To Save Them No Matter How They Were Living

- The Jews trusted in externals rather than God who could change the heart through His Word
- They falsely believed if they were circumcised and observed the Sabbath and other traditions, they were saved
- We too can trust in externals like baptism and the Lord's supper substituting them for serving God from our hearts, being changed by His Word from inside out

They Trusted In Externals To Save Them No Matter How They Were Living

Rom 2:25 For indeed circumcision is of value if you practice the Law; but if you are a transgressor of the Law, your circumcision has become uncircumcision.

Rom 2:26 So if the uncircumcised man keeps the requirements of the Law, will not his uncircumcision be regarded as circumcision?

They Trusted In Externals To Save Them No Matter How They Were Living

Rom 2:27 And he who is physically uncircumcised, if he keeps the Law, will he not judge you who though having the letter of the Law and circumcision are a transgressor of the Law?

Rom 2:28 For he is not a Jew who is one outwardly, nor is circumcision that which is outward in the flesh.

They Trusted In Externals To Save Them No Matter How They Were Living

Rom 2:29 But he is a Jew who is one inwardly; and circumcision is that which is of the heart, by the Spirit, not by the letter; and his praise is not from men, but from God.

We Must Seek To Fully Obey God's Word From Our Hearts

Rom 6:1 What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin so that grace may increase? Rom 6:2 May it never be! How shall we who died to sin still live in it?

We Must Seek To Fully Obey God's Word From Our Hearts

Rom 6:3 Or do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus have been baptized into His death?

Rom 6:4 Therefore we have been buried with Him through baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.

Rom 6:17 But thanks be to God that though you were slaves of sin, you became obedient from the heart to that form of teaching to which you were committed, Rom 6:18 and having been freed from sin, you became slaves of righteousness.
